This dissertation is a study of Lord Byron's Don Juan that Jerome McGann emphasizes as being "the most important poem published in England between 1667 (when Paradise Lost was issued) and 1850 (when The Prelude finally appeared in print)" (CPW 5: xvii) Both during Byron's lifetime in the British Romantic period and
